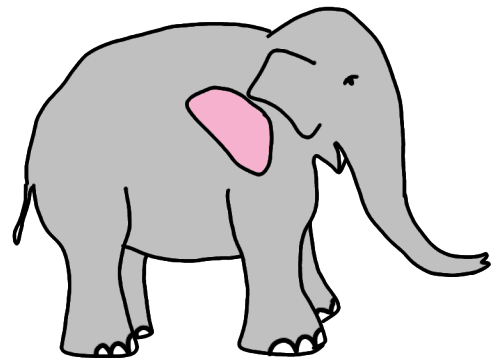
ELEPHANTS SUFFER IN ZOOs!



BECAUSE THEY CAN'T WALK FAR,
THEIR NAILS GROW TOO FAST AND
NEED TO BE CONSTANTLY TRIMMED,
WHICH IS VERY UNNATURAL AND
UNPLEASANT FOR THEM.



THEY STAND ON WET AND DIRTY
SURFACES ALL DAY, EVERY DAY,

TUBERCULOSIS, OR TB, IS A LUNG DISEASE
THAT HAS AFFECTED MANY OF THE ZOO'S
ELEPHANTS. TB ATTACKS THEIR LUNGS,
MAKES THEM COUGH, LOSE WEIGHT AND
BECOME WEAK. IT SPREADS EASILY, SO
SICK ELEPHANTS ARE KEPT AWAY FROM
OTHERS.
